

## The American Legion – Quick History


- Chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veteran's organization
  - Serving veterans, servicemembers, and communities
  - Evolved into an influential leader among nonprofit organizations
- Membership quickly grew to over 1 million with posts across the country.
- Today, membership stands at over 2.4 million in 14,000 posts worldwide.
- Posts organized into 55 departments covering every State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, France, Mexico, and the Philippines.





# Department of North Carolina DISTRICT MAP








## Department of North Carolina DIVISION MAP






## The American Legion – 4 Pillars

- Children & Youth




## The American Legion & Post GOALS:

- Post named for "John E. Jacobs," 27 Jun 2019, to recognize the only Leland resident to die in Vietnam
  - Charter & bylaws updated 119 members
- Growth facilitated Post 68 supporting numerous programs and activities

- One of the fastest-growing Posts in North Carolina.
- Post benefits from many Legionnaires who retired to the area.
- Currently 240+ male and female members from all branches of service with the majority being Vietnam-era veterans along with others from WWII, the Korean War, Desert Storm, and the ongoing war on terror.


#### DEPARTMENT OF NORTH CAROLINA

Pursuant to the authority extended by the National Executive Committee of the American Legion, an original charter was issued to the above Post.

Since the original charter was issued, the Post has incorporated under the laws of its state for the sole purpose of protecting the individual members from liability in the event of litigation against the Post.

#### **Management of Post Affairs**

Administrative affairs are supervised by the Post Executive Committee (PEC), which consists of all elected and appointed Post Officers and three elected "At-Large" Members.

## **BREAK TIME #1**



#### Post Commander



- Serves as the Post's Executive Officer
- Represents the Post in all matters of public affairs
- Holds officers and committee members accountable for the conduct of affairs entrusted to them.
- Presides over and ensures orderly member and PEC meetings.
- Serve as an ex-officio member of all standing committees.
- Prior to annual elections, recommends appropriate candidates for Post elected and appointed positions.
- At the end of term, presents an annual report of Post activities and accomplishments including recommendations for the coming year.

#### 1st Vice Commander

Performs Duties assigned by the Post Commander and acts as the Commander in his/her absence.

Manages Post membership matters including:

- Procuring new members
- Verifying applicant eligibility
- Recording member meeting attendance
- Working with the Adjutant to maintain and update the Membership Roster

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Commander

Performs Duties assigned by the Post Commander and acts as the Commander in his/her absence.

Manages Post patriotism programs and helps develop membership programs, activities, and social events.



## Finance Officer



- Manages all Post financial deposits, transfers, and expenditures.
- Ensures proper timely receipt of funds otherwise held by Post members (e.g., fundraising events).
- Maintains records in accordance with commonly accepted accounting procedures.
- Records transactions under appropriate headings so financial status is readily available.
- Regularly reports on the Post's financial position.

#### Post Historian

- Collects and retains pertinent records and data concerning the annual activities of the Post.
- As determined by the Commander or PEC, performs other duties as may properly pertain to the office.



## Chaplain



- Performs all necessary and appropriate Post religious services in a non-sectarian manner.
- Uses rituals as may be recommended by the National Headquarters of the American Legion.
- Shall not impose personal religious tenets on members.
- Keeps a record of veterans' graves and serves as be ex-officio chairman of the Funeral Committee.

## Sergeant At Arms

- Arranges the meeting hall, assisting the Commander and Adjutant in preliminary arrangements.
  - Preserves order at all meetings
- Leads the color detail at presentation and retirement ceremonies. \*\* (Bob Northrup)
- Plays a leading role in the Color Guard, burial detail, and other pageantry.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the Commander or PEC.





## Members At Large







- Prepare and present the Post annual financial audit.
- As directed by the Commander, review processes and procedures to identify areas for improvement
- Oversees implementation of changes.
- Perform other analysis/oversight as directed by the Commander and the PEC
- Serve as members of the Election Committee, if so appointed.
- Provide At-Large member meeting minutes to the Post Adjutant.

## **Adjutant**

 Serves as the Post's primary administrative officer. Duties include but are not limited to:



- Maintains and secures all personnel records.
- Records and distributes all applicable meeting Minutes.
- Collects, manages, and reports on members' dues.
- Publishes official orders, announcements, and communication with Post members.
- Maintains a comprehensive and secure filing system of all Post, Department, and National records.

## Service Officer

- Updates veterans and dependents on rights and benefits granted them by law.
- Assists veterans and their families in filing claims and pension applications, as appropriate.
- Identifies veterans and veteran's families in need;
   visits families of recently deceased veterans.
- Cooperates with the NC Veterans Commission and the Veterans Administration.
- Performs other duties as may be assigned by the PEC or the Commander.



#### **Parliamentarian**



- Advises the presiding officer and other Post officers, committees, and members on matters of parliamentary procedure and provides non-legal advice during meetings.
- Performs other duties as may be incident to the office.

## Logistics Officer

### Supports Post operations and activities by:

- Working with the Commander to coordinate and administer Post physical resources and assets.
- Purchasing, receiving, storing, and issuing all materials in support of the mission and activities, as may be requested or approved by the Commander, Finance Officer, and PEC.



#### **Public Relations**

#### Maintains and enhances the Post's visibility and reputation:

- Plans publicity strategies and campaigns.
- Prepares presentations, press releases, reports, articles, leaflets, and brochures for appropriate distribution.
- Handles public, press, and other organizations' inquiries.
- Organizes and attends promotional events.
- Speaks at interviews, press conferences, and presentations;
- Analyzes media coverage.
- Undertakes relevant market research.



## Membership Coordinator

- Assists the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Commander with all matters concerning Post membership.
- Supports individual members to improve member retention and participation.
- In coordination with Post leadership and members, recognizes and supports current members.
- Actively works to secure new members.

- Post 68 has provided more VEAC volunteers than any other Post in Southeast NC!










